ISC PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

ALL PARTICIPANTS - INCLUDING PLAYERS, COACHES AND CHAPERONES - MUST AGREE TO ACCEPT AND ABIDE BY THE RULES OF THE ISC.

The following guidelines and rules shall apply to all participants of the ISC and all activities within the ISC. Failure to comply with any of the guidelines and/or rules listed below will result in the immediate dismissal of the offending individual and the immediate dismissal of the offending individual's entire team.

1. GENERAL GUIDELINES:

- A) Participants are expected to conduct themselves as respectful guests of Southwest Youth Services (SYS) and the University of New Mexico (UNM), the hosts of the Indigenous Soccer Cup, at all times.
- B) The ISC is conducted as a closed campus event. All participants, coaches, and chaperones are required to remain on campus for the entirety of the event, unless otherwise negotiated with the ISC Directors. In special circumstances, if there is need to leave the ISC, permission must be obtained directly from the ISC Directors.
- C) Participants are expected to conduct themselves in a manner, which is in alignment with representing their respective team, tribe, nation/state/province/territory, and will not bring discredit upon the Indigenous Soccer Cup.
- D) The ISC is a closed-campus event, meaning that attendance and participation in all ISC activities is mandatory and all participants are required to remain on ISC premises until appropriate dismissal from ISC grounds by the ISC Directors.
- E) Attendance and participation in Positive Youth Development workshops, hosted by the ISC is MANDATORY. Failure to attend workshops on behalf of the ISC participant will result in exclusion from any and all games during the ISC tournament.
- F) 2017 ISC participants arriving early prior to the start of the ISC or after the conclusion of the ISC are responsible for their meals, accommodations, and transportation.
- G) All ISC participants are responsible for arriving to all ISC events on time.

RESPECT FOR PROPERTY OF OTHERS, ADHERENCE TO RULES AND GUIDELINES AS SPECIFIED HERE OR BY THE COACH/ ADMINISTRATOR, AND OBSERVANCE OF STATE AND FEDERAL LAWS ARE REQUIRED FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE INDIGENOUS SOCCER CUP.

2. DISCIPLINE RULES:

- A) Substance use and/or possession of-Drugs, Alcohol, and/or Tobacco-is cause for immediate dismissal from the ISC.
- B) Persistent irresponsible and disrespectful behavior will result in dismissal from the ISC.
- C) Destruction of property or violation of state and federal law will result in dismissal from the ISC.
- D) Failure to comply with any and all event, team, or specific activity rules is cause for disciplinary action and will be left up to the discretion of the ISC Directors. Persistent failure is cause for dismissal from the tournament of the offending individual and offending individual's entire team. Failure to comply will affect a team's future participation in the ISC. Please consult your ISC Rulebook for more information.
 - i. 1st OFFENSE: Ineligibility in the next scheduled soccer game.
 - ii. 2nd OFFENSE: The players' team will forfeit the next scheduled soccer game.
 - iii. 3rd OFFENSE: The player will be dismissed from the tournament premises immediately.

*** PENALIZATION IS UP TO THE DESCRETION OF THE ISC DIRECTORS***

3. SPECTATOR CONDUCT:

- A) The ISC is a positive youth development event. Spectators, team coaches, and chaperones must work to create a positive atmosphere; spectators' comments should be positive and supportive to all players.
- B) Failure to comply with the spectator code of conduct will result in penalization and possible forfeit to the teams competing. Unruly fans will be ejected from the ISC tournament grounds for the remainder of the tournament.
- C) PLEASE NOTE: If dismissal from the ISC occurs, teams may be dismissed immediately from the premises of the Indigenous Soccer Cup and must make consequent lodging and/or travel arrangements at their own cost. No reimbursement of registration fees will be made to dismissed players, coaches, chaperones, or dismissed players' families.
